


Welcome to our November 2023 Newsletter

In the Spotlight..... Harmful Sexual Behaviour

The Lucy Faithfull Foundation has published a report evaluating the first year of its project to tackle harmful sexual behaviour (HSB) in schools in the UK. Key points from the Foundation's work with ten schools include: emotional dysregulation and experiences of abuse in the home were identified by staff and students as some potential causes of HSB; schools highlighted concerns around image-sharing, understanding consent and the impact of pornography; and perceptions and experiences of safety among students varied widely. The report recommends training staff in the protective behaviours process and delivering bystander education directly to students. Read the full report here

In Darlington, a recent deep dive was carried out looking at cases of Harmful Sexual Behaviour in children. Following a discussion on the findings, the Children's MASH Operational Group suggested a revision is made to the Harmful Sexual Behaviour Protocol to reflect the findings that appropriate support is provided to those who have been harmed and strategy meetings held on those who may be harmed but who may also harm as they may also pose a risk. For children already in the Youth Justice arena, a support programme is in place that can be referred into. The revised HSB guidance can be found on the DSP website.

Anti-Bullying Week 2023: Make A Noise About Bullying

Anti-Bullying Week 2023 is coordinated in England, Wales and Northern Ireland by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. This year it has the theme 'Make A Noise About Bullying' and will take place from Monday 13th to Friday 17th November. The week will be kicked off with Odd Socks Day on Monday 13th November, where adults and children wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. Following the success of the campaign in 2022 – when 80% of schools marked the week, reaching over 7.5 million children and young people – Anti-Bullying Week will remind everyone whether it's in school, at home, in the community or online, we can bring an end to bullying.
